14 April 2024



Last Sunday's Gospel ended with these words: *"There were many other signs that Jesus worked, and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God and that believing this, you may have life through his name."* (John 20:31)

This ending reminds us to recognise Christ in the Scriptures. We should remember that He is present in the Scriptures we read at Mass. If we want to know more about Christ and his life, we must read and listen to the Word of God. Secondly, we must be sensitive to the signs we see in the Eucharistic celebration. Let us remember that his disciples did not instantly recognise the risen Christ on their way to Emmaus, but as soon as He *"broke the bread,"* they came to recognise Him.

The lesson that we can get from this gospel passage is "recognition". We should remember that each time we come to the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, we enter into the "world of signs and symbols." Therefore, we must be attentive to the gestures, actions, language, and prayers that are part of the liturgy. Through these visible realities, the liturgy invites us to enter into the invisible and recognise Christ's "real presence" in the Eucharist and encounter him in receiving his Body and Blood in the Holy Communion.

Today, we are saying goodbye to Valerie Nyam and Art Looi along with their children Joshua, Grace, and Joseph as they are moving to Malaysia. Art and Valerie are well-known to many parishioners, especially those who attend the Jindalee church. Joshua served at the altar at the Twelve Apostles, and Grace celebrated the sacrament of Reconciliation at the beginning of this year. Art and Valerie became a part of our parish at the beginning of 2000 and quickly joined the parish ministries, embracing the parish life. We bid them farewell with heartfelt wishes and thank God for the time they shared their faith with us and journeyed together in these last 4 years.

As we see this faith filled young family leaving our parish we say our goodbye with sadness we will miss you. We pray for you and wish you all the best in this new adventure entrusting you into Our Lady's motherly care. God Bless and travelling across Malaysia we might meet you there. Blessings, Fr Jan

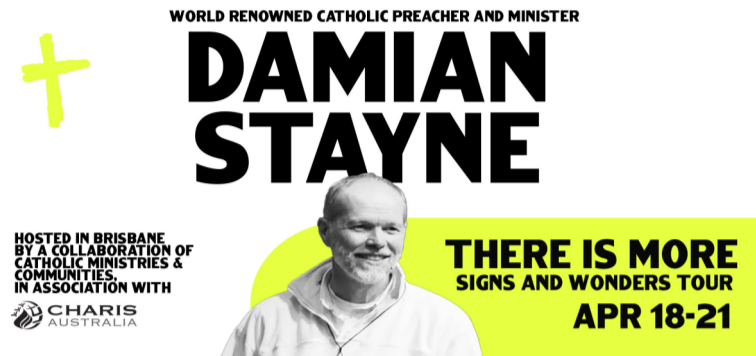

3:13-15,17-19

You killed the prince of life: God, however, raised him from the dead

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate after Pilate had decided to release him. Gospel according to St Luke 24:35-48

It is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'
