## **5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR B 2024** 28 April 2024



Today's image of the vineyard emphasises the importance of communion between the vine and its branches. Jesus used this metaphor to teach us that a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains connected to the vine. In the same way, we cannot grow spiritually unless we remain in the Risen Lord.

From today's Gospel, we learn that our spiritual life requires a consistent and ongoing connection with Jesus. This connection happens within the Church,

primarily through the Sacraments, particularly the Eucharist. Pope Francis reminds us that we are not isolated little islands, and we are not Christians individually. Our Christian identity is to belong to the Church.

However, in our day, more and more people seem to be drifting away from the Church for different reasons. But when that connection with the Church is broken, the branch withers and dies. During the Easter season, the Gospel readings depict Jesus in different symbolic ways: "I am the Good Shepherd," "I am the Bread of Life," and today's Gospel: "I am the vine." These metaphors are about intimacy and communion with Christ. Through these symbolic references, the Easter Gospels call us to be immersed in the community's life and the Church, no matter how painful and challenging this may be.

To abide in the vine means always being committed to growing in the life of prayer and sanctification and never feeling satisfied with the bare minimum.

#### 5th Sunday of Easter April 28 2024

#### First Reading

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31

He explained how the Lord appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey.

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus.

Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

#### Psalm Ps 21:26-28, 30-32, R. v.26

#### (R.) I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.

1. My vows I will pay before those who fear him.

The poor shall eat and shall have their fill. They shall praise the Lord, those who seek him. May their hearts live for ever and ever! (R.)

- 2. All the earth shall remember and return to the Lord, all families of the nations worship before him. They shall worship him, all the mighty of the earth; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust. (R.)
- 3. And my soul shall live for him, my children serve him. They shall tell of the Lord to generations yet to come, declare his faithfulness to peoples yet unborn: 'These things the Lord has done.' (R.)

# A reading from the first letter of St John 1 John 3:18-

His commandments are these: that we believe and that we love one another.

My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are the children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence,

whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything.

My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence,

and whatever we ask him, we shall receive,

because we keep his commandments

and live the kind of life that he wants.

His commandments are these:

that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to.

Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him.

We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

Live in me and let me live in you, says the Lord; my branches bear much fruit.

#### Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 15:1-8

All who live in me, and I in them, bear much fruit.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser.

Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away,

and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more.

You are pruned already,

by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself,

but must remain part of the vine,

neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine,

you are the branches.

Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty;

for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away

he withers;

these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt.

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, You may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'

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
