## PENTECOST SUNDAY YEAR B 2024 19 MAY 2024



At the end of the Easter season, the feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to continue the mission of Jesus.

**Today**, the Church continues this mission, and all baptised have been empowered to do this job at Confirmation. In our preparation, we learned that this Sacrament gives us, in a unique way, **the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit**.

Possibly, at the time, we might have been able to recite them by heart. Believe it or not, you still have these gifts. The Holy Spirit has never taken them back, even though you may have become unaware of them.

The gift of **Wisdom** enables us to judge things correctly, especially how they will affect our eternal salvation. **Understanding** gives us insight into the mysteries of faith so that we may live by them. **Counsel** is the gift through which we receive the light to guide us in practical matters. **Fortitude** gives us Christ-like courage to love God in the face of obstacles and challenges. **Knowledge** enables us to see God reflected in all creatures and yet to see their comparative nothingness so that we will desire God alone. **Piety** causes us to reverence God as our Father and zeal in prayer and worship. **Fear of the Lord** (*today called wonder and awe*) gives us great awe and reverence for God and keeps us from offending Him by sin.

St. Thomas Aquinas compares these gifts to the sails on a boat, which help the vessel on its journey. These gifts help us on our journey toward heaven. Every year Pentecost reminds us of the importance of the Holy Spirit on our journey toward heaven.

This year, on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening and blessing of the Cathedral of St Stephen. From its solemn dedication and blessing in 1874 and celebration of the first Mass on May 17<sup>th</sup> by Bishop John Polding to its present-day St Stephen's is the heart of the life of our Archdiocese.



Every year, at the Lord's Supper celebration, the Archbishop, surrounded by the priests and the faithful, blesses the oils used at the Sacramental celebrations which nurture and nourish us on our journey of faith.

Below is a short historical summary of St Stephen's Cathedral. Bishop James Quinn, the first bishop of Brisbane diocese, laid the cathedral's foundation stone on the feast of St Stephen on 26 December 1863. Despite the harsh economic depression of the mid-1860s, which led to only part of the original foundations being laid, the builders demonstrated remarkable perseverance. They resumed work in 1870, using the existing foundations.

**On Sunday, 17 May 1874**, the still-incomplete cathedral was solemnly blessed and dedicated. It covered about a third of the area of the one first planned, a testament to their unwavering dedication. Archbishop Robert Dunne added the top of the gable and the spires to the Elizabeth Street facade in 1884. The cathedral was then enriched with stained glass and marble.

**On 3 October 1920**, Archbishop James Duhig laid the foundation stone of new transepts, marking the beginning of a grand vision. He had already announced plans to build a massive Renaissance cathedral in Ann Street, Fortitude Valley. The foundation stones of a cathedral dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus were laid in a splendid ceremony on Sunday, 16 September 1928, before a crowd of 35,000 people. These foundation stones, now located at the joint between the 1921-22 extension and that of 1988-89, stand as a testament to the grandeur and meticulous design of the cathedral.

Under Archbishop Patrick O'Donnell, temporary solutions were found to the difficulties of celebrating a rapidly changing liturgy in a traditional liturgical space.

Archbishop Francis Rush undertook a comprehensive restoration, renovation, and extension of the Cathedral during the 1980s, a period that saw significant changes in the city's landscape. His efforts culminated in **the cathedral's**

**dedication on 4 December 1989**, a testament to his commitment to preserving the historical and architectural value of the Cathedral of St Stephen.

Archbishop John Bathersby blessed the Jubilee Pipe Organ on 29 October 2000. He also authorised the restoration of St Stephen's Chapel, where a diocesan shrine to Mary Mackillop was established.

On Saturday May 18th Archbishop Mark Coleridge celebrates his 50th anniversary of priesthood. With our congratulations we thank Archbishop Mark for his dedicated ministry in our Archdiocese of Brisbane.

May God bless him with good health and may the gifts of the Holy Spirit guide him as he leads us on our journey of faith.

## Pentecost Sunday Year B

19 May 2024

### First Reading

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

*They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.*

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

## Second Reading 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

*In the one Spirit we were all baptised, making one body.*

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
