The Gospels often highlight how God acts in the world and human lives using small and insignificant things—today's parables about the sower and the mustard seed point to this principle. Jesus chose a few helpers to continue his mission of building God's Kingdom on earth. Most of them were simple fishermen; humanly speaking, it is difficult to understand how these people could continue Jesus' mission in the middle of obstacles and hardships. In his commentary on today's Gospel reading, St John Chrysostom (the 4th-century theologian) says – "through the mustard seed parable, Jesus emphasises the importance of faith because, essentially, the growth of the kingdom of God is based on faith".

The Kingdom of God has its beginning in the human heart. Through baptism, we have been incorporated into the great family of God. With the grace of baptism came the grace of faith, which is like a tiny seed. True spiritual life begins with a small seed hidden in the ground. And no one knows anything about it (except the one who sowed it – God). The strength and courage of the seed are not in its own abilities or ambitions. The strength of the seed comes from an open heart – a heart that longs for the rain of God's grace. Our personal connection to God's grace, based on faith, leads us to true growth and strength in the Kingdom of God. When we open our hearts to the rain of God's grace, we grow not for ourselves but to bear the fruit of the Holy Spirit: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control". If our faith produces these fruits, the Kingdom of God grows like the mustard seed Jesus refers to in today's Gospel. Fr Jan

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What is grace?

The simple definition of **grace** is God's favour. But what it means to receive such benevolence is demonstrated in boundless ways. How do we "get" **grace** or know it when it's operating? We recognise **grace** in the divine mercy, forgiveness, and rescue at work in our lives. The church's sacraments are ways in which we acquire **grace**. Church fathers went so far as to say that sacraments "divinize" us: God becomes flesh so that flesh can share in God's immortality.

Saint Augustine proposed that **grace** heals and liberates our sin-inclined wills so we can do the will of God. Without **grace**, we're literally lost. Saint Thomas Aquinas envisioned **grace** as elevating us to a higher level of union with God. Thomas Merton saw **grace** as the antidote to the "death dance" in our blood. However you define **grace**, it comes to us unmerited and free of charge. God doesn't "owe" us **grace** even if we're saintly every moment of the day. But like any gift that comes in a pretty package, **grace** is not fully received if we don't open the gift and make use of it. This gift of grace is available to all, regardless of our past or present circumstances.



First Reading Ezekiel 17:22-24

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I have made the small tree great.

The Lord says this:

'From the top of the cedar,

from the highest branch I will take a shoot

and plant it myself on a very high mountain.

I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel.

It will sprout branches and bear fruit,

and become a noble cedar.

Every kind of bird will live beneath it,

every winged creature rest in the shade of its branches.

And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one

who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow, who withers green trees and makes the withered green.

I, the Lord, have spoken, and I will do it.'

Responsorial Psalm

Second Reading

2 Corinthians 5:6-10

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the

Corinthians

Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight – we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia!

The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower; all who come to him will live for ever. Alleluia!

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 4:26-34

The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
