23rd June 2024 YEAR B

The Gospel we read on the 12th Sunday tells us how Jesus calmed with a simple command, "Quiet! Be still!" as St Mark says, "The wind dropped, and all was calm again." When the disciples (experienced fishermen) witnessed this miracle of calming the stormy waters, they asked, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'

An answer to the Apostles' question can be found in today's first reading of the book of Job. The passage has a question asked by God, to which Job cannot answer: "Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, (where were you) when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate?" ([Job 38: 8-11](#))



Asking this question in the midst of his pain and drama, Job dared to scrutinise God's wisdom and power. However, he quickly came to a humbling realisation that his own wisdom and power meant nothing compared to God's. This Sunday's readings (especially the Gospel) echo the first article of the Creed we profess every Sunday, affirming our belief in one God, the Father almighty, the creator of all things visible and invisible. **"I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible."**

In a poetic way, this article of our faith is expressed in the two last verses of today's psalm:

"Then they cried to the Lord in their need, and he rescued them from their distress.
He stilled the storm to a whisper: all the waves of the sea were hushed.
They rejoiced because of the calm, and he led them to the haven they desired."

The untimed haven we desire is eternal life, and God's Son is with us on our travel to this destination as he was with his disciples when on the boat they were crossing "over to the other side."

1: SYNOD24: I Am Making All Things New will be held in September and October.

2: If you and/or other members of your parish will be attending the synod. (A full list of Synod Members will be published closer to the time).

3: Our Archdiocesan synod is the next step on the Plenary Council journey and will discern practical and measurable actions that we will take as an Archdiocese to implement the focus areas (Decrees) that came out of the Plenary Council.

4: We are all asked to pray for those participating in the synod.

5: Resources for parishes and communities to engage in synodal conversations and spiritual conversations will be made available at the end of June. These resources will include simple versions of the Plenary Council Decrees and guided questions so the community can discern actions they would like to take to be a more co-responsible church on mission.

6: There will be a series of presentations given around the Archdiocese in July and August on what synodality actually is, what it means for the global church and for our own community. Information on these presentations will be made available in the next two weeks.

First Reading

A reading from the book of Job 38:1. 8-11

Here I have set the boundaries of the sea.

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer.

He said:

Who pent up the sea behind closed doors

Second Reading

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 5:14-17

All things are made new.

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.
