

21st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 25th August 2024 YEAR B

Today, we hear the conclusion of the sixth chapter of John's Gospel. It is the finale of Jesus' great discourse on the Eucharist, the Bread that comes down from heaven. Jesus invites His listeners to eat His Body and drink His Blood. This teaching is difficult for Jews to accept. They began to murmur and openly contest Jesus' words.

It turns out that it is also difficult for Jesus' disciples to accept the teaching about the necessity of eating His Body and Blood. Jesus' words shake their thinking about the Master.

Jesus explains that the remedy to heal this way of thinking is deep faith — **faith that Jesus' words are Spirit and life.** If one thinks in terms of the flesh and according to the flesh, in a human and limited way, such a person won't understand this teaching and will depart from Jesus.

With large crowds departing, Jesus asks his disciples, 'What about you? Do you want to go away too?' Jesus' question was not just a test but a call to reaffirm the disciples' commitment to Him. In his famous profession of faith, Peter answers Jesus' question with unwavering devotion. He rhetorically asks, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.' In this powerful declaration, Peter confirms that nothing and no one, apart from Jesus, holds such value that one can devote one's life to. It is Jesus who has the words of eternal life, and only He guides us in our journey of faith into eternity. At every Eucharist, he also gives us his Body and Blood to nourish us on this journey to heaven.

The day was a spirit-stirring gathering of faith, worship, family, community and love. In a very special way we wish to extend our gratitude to the following people who made this occasion possible:



Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

First Reading Joshua 24:1-2. 15-18

A reading from the book of Joshua

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people: 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.'

The people answered, 'We have no intention of deserting the Lord and serving other gods! Was it not the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors out of the land of Egypt, the house of slavery, who worked those great wonders before our eyes and preserved us all along the way we travelled and among all the peoples through whom we journeyed. We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God.'

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before?

'It is the spirit that gives life,the flesh has nothing to offer.The words I have spoken to you are spiritand they are life.

'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him.

Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'
