Today's Gospel reminds us of human nature and its inclination to seek dominance over others. James and John sought the most important positions among the Apostles, forgetting about the others. Ambition can be positive as it drives human development and encourages growth. However, not all ambition is healthy. Healthy ambition involves setting noble goals and working to achieve them in ways that improve the situations of others. On the other hand, unhealthy ambition seeks domination over others.

Forms of domination can take many different shapes. For example, the strong may rule over the weak, the rich over the poor, the educated over the uneducated and so on. In today's Gospel, Christ strongly opposes these tendencies. While the world may measure a person's greatness by the number of people they rule

over or who serve them, in God's eyes, true greatness is measured by the number of people one serves. This means that each act of service, no matter how small, is significant and contributes to true greatness.

Reflecting on today's Gospel, it might be worth considering how many people around us serve us in our families, communities, and parishes. They cook, clean, care for the elderly, raise children, and perform hundreds of other tasks. What is our attitude towards them? Do we act as those who expect to be served, or are prepared to serve others too? Remember that as Christ's disciples, we are called to serve, not to be served.

We wish Bishop Tim well on his new appointment as the Shepherd in the Diocese of Broome, Western Australia. The Diocese of Broom covers an area comprising all that territory lying between the Tropic of Capricorn from the Northern Territory border westward to the 121st degree of longitude, thence a direct line north intercepting and following the Oakover River to the De Grey River, following that river to the Western Australia coastline, then travelling in a northerly direction to the Timor Sea and Northern Territory border and encompassing several islands along that coastline. Area: 773,000 sq km.





Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'
