Angelic Swords of Light

Have you ever seen those pictures of angels? They look like babies with delicate gossamer wings. How sentimental, trivial, and untrue. Angels are more like the light swords wielded by Luke Skywalker in Star Wars. The good angels are lightning flashes of energy serving God's purpose in the battle against evil forces that can seem to dominate our private and social worlds.

God loved us into existence so that we could share in his life, but forces of darkness and evil are at work trying to frustrate that. There is a cosmic-scale battle going on. Who is on our side in that battle? The angels. Who are they?

They are non-bodily beings of great intelligence and power. Those are the angels, and those who have chosen to love and serve God are on our side.

Some are archangels with a cosmic-scale brief. We hear of one in the first reading: 'Michael, the great Prince who stands guard over your people'. Others are our individual Guardian Angels so that when powers of darkness seem to engulf us, we can turn to our Guardian Angel and say: 'Fight for me', and that light-sword of God will engage in battle because that is that sort of angel's way of serving God. We could pause a moment to pray, thanking God for the Archangels who guard our church community and for our personal Guardian Angels, and asking our Lord Jesus Christ to command those angels to gather us as his chosen to share His glory.

THE APPOINTMENT OF NEW CARDINALS

Pope Francis announced on Oct. 6 that he would create 21 new cardinals. The new cardinal electors come from six continents, including bishops from Australia (bishop Mykola Bychok of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Eparchy of Saints Peter and Paul in Melbourne), Canada, Indonesia, and Iran.

What is the role of a cardinal?

From Latin *cardo*, for "hinge," a high church official who ranks just below the pope can only be appointed by the pope and serves primarily as a papal advisor.

The significance of the office of the cardinal lies in a direct and close relationship to the pope. The worldwide governance of the church is no small thing, and the burden is just a little lighter when cardinals share in the responsibilities as papal advisors, celebrants, envoys, and representatives.

The cardinals are a unique figure of Roman Catholicism. They exercise major influence in the church, not only because they form the college that elects the bishop of Rome but also because they occupy significant positions in the church's central administration and, increasingly, are the diocesan bishops of major sees around the world.

Cardinals were originally priests with permanent parish assignments. The title was first given to the superior priest at a major church in the fifth century. Cardinal priests judged clergy and laity, later serving as grand inquisitors in determining heresies. Cardinals became electors of the pope in the 11th century by decree of Pope Nicholas II. Cardinals formed a corporation called a college. Their office came to outrank bishops, and in 1514, Leo X placed cardinals just under the pope. The 1917 Code of Canon Law made it imperative for cardinals to be chosen from the clergy—previously, a layman could be designated. Pope John XXIII shrunk the pool to bishops in 1962. Paul VI confined papal voting to cardinals under the age of 80. Today, most cardinals are elevated from bishops in prominent dioceses. The College of Cardinals functions primarily as a consulting body for the pope as well as aiding in the governance of the church throughout the world. Reining in these "princes of the church" has been the challenge of many popes.




