2nd SUNDAY OF ADVENT 8th December 2024 YEAR C

On December 8, the Church honours Our Lady by recalling the moment of her Immaculate Conception. When the beautiful lady appeared at Lourdes to Bernadette Soubirous, young Bernadette asked who the beautiful lady was, "I am the Immaculate Conception" was the answer. Surprisingly, the beautiful lady wanted to be known not by a personal name but by a mysterious event in her life.

The Immaculate Conception is the name by which Mary revealed herself to Bernadette Soubirous in Lourdes, and the Church honours this mystery in December. As December 8 falls on Sunday in 2024, the feast has been moved to Monday, December 9. "Hail Mary, full of grace..." We all grow up hearing these words, but what does it mean to say that Mary was "full of grace"? Mary's Immaculate Conception answers this question.

Full of grace means that from the moment Mary came into existence, she was so full of God's grace that she was preserved from original sin and kept safe from sin throughout her life.

God knew that Jesus's coming to earth would be an event unlike any other in human history, and Mary would play a unique role in making it possible. That's why God made Mary the first to benefit from Jesus's saving mission.

Looking upon Our Lady, we can recognise the beauty of God's plan for every person and every one of us, which is a call to holiness.

If we want to be holy, we must be filled with God's grace and say "yes" to God's Word. Pope Benedict XVI says that Mary is the Mother of the Yes. As her children, let us follow her in saying yes to God daily.

Sunday 08 Dec 2024 Second Sunday of Advent C

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.
