The scene from today's Gospel follows the account of the Annunciation—that moment when the angel Gabriel came to Mary with God's message. Reflecting on the Annunciation, we realise that God never forces us to do anything. Although God is all-powerful, God never takes away our freedom. Therefore, God has to ask when he wants us to do something. This is why today's gospel is so important. Because God's plan to send his son into the world depended upon the answer of a woman. In order for the saviour to be born, Mary had to say yes. If Mary had said no, God could have asked someone else. But it would have made things different. Jesus would have grown up with another mother and in another home. It is clear that God wanted Mary, so God sent the angel Gabriel to lay out the plan. Mary

listened, asked questions, and finally accepted God's offer and said yes.

Normally, when we think about agreeing to something or saying that we are willing to participate in someone else's plan, we say, "Yes, I'll do it. But that is not what Mary said. The text is clear. Mary doesn't say, "I'll do what God wants." She says, "Let it be done to me according to your word." Mary doesn't say, "I'll do it." She says, "I'll let God do it to me." Now, this is a fundamental description of faith. Faith is not us doing things for God. It is God doing things for us.

Vanuatu has experienced two earthquakes within 24 hours impacting over 116,000 people and causing significant damage to buildings and infrastructure. The main hospital in Port Vila has sustained extensive damage and is overwhelmed by the mass causalities.

There are hundreds of people have been injured or trapped under rubble and at least 14 people deceased with the death toll expected to continue to rise. People remain fearful of further disaster, as Vanuatu is one of the most susceptible countries to natural disasters such as earthquakes, storm damage, flooding, and tsunamis.

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Micah 5:1-4

The Lord says this:

You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old. The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth. Then the remnant of his brothers will come back to the sons of Israel. He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land. He himself will be peace.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews 10:5-10

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world:

You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me.

You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin; then I said,

just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'
