THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD (CHRISTMAS)

25 December 2024 YEAR C



"Joseph went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger because there was no place for them in the inn." (Luke 2: 5-7)

Every year on Christmas Eve, the passage from St. Luke's Gospel touches our hearts. The nativity scene beautifully expresses God's tender love and mercy. The mystery of the Incarnation amazes us, as God becomes a child to be close to us, allowing us to love Him in return. St. Luke tells us that God's Son was born in a manger "because there was no place for them in the inn."

On Christmas Day, a similar remark is made when St. John comments on the lack of room at the inn. He gets to the core of the issue when he writes, "He came to his own home, and his own people received him not" (John 1:11).

May the peace and blessings of Christmas be yours, and may the coming year, 2025 be filled with joy, good health and Mary's eagerness to do God's will in your lives.

May there always be enough room for God in our lives and hearts so that He might be the beginning and the end of all our activities in 2025.

At Easter Vigil, preparing the Paschal candle for the blessing, the priest says: Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, the Alpha and the Omega. All time belongs to him and all the ages. To him be glory and power through every age and forever. Amen.

THE JUBILEE YEAR OF 2025

Pilgrims of Hope Excerpt from Archbishop of Brisbane Mark Coleridge

Pope Francis will inaugurate the Jubilee Year of 2025 on Christmas Eve this year. It will come to its conclusion on the feast of the Epiphany 2026. He has invited all the dioceses of the world to inaugurate the Jubilee locally on **Sunday, 29 December,** which is not the most convenient time in this part of the world. Nonetheless, the Dean of St Stephen's will lead a celebration inaugurating the Jubilee at the Cathedral, blessing the Holy Door and leading the people through it as a sign of walking as pilgrims with Christ into newness of life. I invite parishes and deaneries to be as creative as possible in inaugurating and celebrating the Jubilee Year.

The motto of this Jubilee Year is "Pilgrims of Hope". Any journey we make through this year we make not as tourists or holiday-makers but as pilgrims. It is a journey of faith. And it is driven by a hope which is not mere wishful thinking but the proclamation of a true hope in a world which often seems hopeless, a hope grounded ultimately in Easter. This hope is an expectation that what God has done in Jesus he will do in the world and even the cosmos.

God will bring light from darkness, life from death.

The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that "there remains a sabbath rest for the people of God" (4:9). In a deeply restless world, may this Jubilee Year be a time of sabbath which God alone can provide, refreshing our souls and putting new heart into the Church as we take the path traced by the Archdiocesan Synod and its Action Plans. Amen.

The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) Day

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful on the mountains, are the feet of one who brings good news, who heralds peace, brings happiness, proclaims salvation, and tells Zion, 'Your God is king!' Listen! Your watchmen raise their voices, they shout for joy together, for they see the Lord face to face, as he returns to Zion. Break into shouts of joy together, you ruins of Jerusalem; for the Lord is consoling his people, redeeming Jerusalem. The Lord bares his holy arm in the sight of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Responsorial Psalm 97: 1-6

(R.) All the ends of the earth have seen the saving power of God.

- Sing a new song to the Lord for he has worked wonders.
 His right hand and his holy arm have brought salvation. (R.)
- The Lord has made known his salvation; has shown his justice to the nations.

Second Reading

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews 1:1-6

At various times in the past and in various different ways, God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; but in our own time, the last days, he has spoken to us through his Son, the Son that he has appointed to inherit everything and through whom he made everything there is. He is the radiant light of God's glory and the perfect copy of his nature, sustaining the universe by his powerful command; and now that he has destroyed the defilement of sin, he has gone to take his place in heaven at the right hand of divine Maj-

esty. So he is now as far above the angels as the title which he has inherited is higher than their own name.

God has never said to any angel: You are my Son, today I have become your father, or: I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Again, when he brings the First-born into the world, he says: Let all the angels of God worship him.

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 1:1-5. 9-14

In the beginning was the Word:
the Word was with God
and the Word was God.
He was with God in the beginning.
Through him all things came to be,
not one thing had its being but through him.
All that came to be had life in him
and that life was the light of men,
a light that shines in the dark,
a light that darkness could not overpower.

The Word was the true light that enlightens all men; and he was coming into the world. He was in the world that had its being through him, and the world did not know him. He came to his own domain and his own people did not accept him. But to all who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to all who believe in the name of him who was born not out of human stock or urge of the flesh or will of man but of God himself. The Word was made flesh, he lived among us. And we saw his glory, the glory that is his as the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth.
