# 3rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 26th January 2025 Year C



In celebrating Australia Day, firstly it is appropriate to be grateful to God for all the blessings we have in being able to live in this great country. We know that many nations and peoples do not enjoy all the peace, prosperity, and social stability available to us in Australia. The Gospel of the Beatitudes is read in the Liturgy of the Word for Australia Day. This passage from St. Matthew, often referred to as the 'Sermon on the Mount,' presents a vision of a society where the usual expectations of how people interact with one another are turned upside down.

Australia, or 'Down Under', has attracted many people with the promise of a different future, one where individuals can relate to each other in ways that

differ from the norms of their societies of origin. The Portuguese explorer of the 16th century, Pedro Fernández de Quirós, embarked on a quest for 'Terra Australia del Espiritu Santo', or the South Land of the Holy Spirit.

I believe that Australia is a land of the Holy Spirit, whose distinctive work at Pentecost broke down the cultural, ethnic and language barriers that separate people. Australia is a place where the Pentecostal impulse fosters the creation of a new society.

Have we fully responded to the guidance of the Holy Spirit? Not completely. The treatment of the earliest inhabitants of this land has often failed to reflect the teachings of the Gospel of the Beatitudes. As we move from the past to the present, it is evident that much work still needs to be done to make Australia a true land of the Holy Spirit, reflecting the values of the Gospel of the Beatitudes. Being aware of the work that needs to be done, we pray, "Come Holy Spirit of the Great South Land. Come fill the hearts of the faithful and all its inhabitants. Come kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your grace that Australians might be re-created. Come renew the face of the earth".

God's grace be with you. Fr Jan.



#### **Sunday 26 Jan 2025**

### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

#### **First Reading**

## A reading from the book of Nehemiah 8:2-6. 8-10

They read from the book of Law and they understood what was read.

Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women, and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women, and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people – since he stood higher than all the people – Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered Amen! Amen!; then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read.

Then Nehemiah — His Excellency — and Ezra, priest and scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people, 'This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep'. For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law.

He then said, 'Go, eat the fat, drink the sweet wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. For this day is sacred to our Lord. Do not be sad: the joy of the Lord is your stronghold.'

# A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 12:12-14, 27

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Nor is the body to be identified with any one of its many parts. Now you together are Christ's body; but each of you is a different part of it.

#### Gospel

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 1:1-4. 4:14-21

Seeing that many others have undertaken to draw up accounts of the events that have taken place among us, exactly as these were handed down to us by those who from the outset were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, I in my turn, after carefully going over the whole story from the beginning, have decided to write an ordered account for you, Theophilus, so that your Excellency may learn how well founded the teaching is that you have received.

Jesus, with the power of the Spirit in him, returned to Galilee; and his reputation spread throughout the countryside. He taught in their synagogues and everyone praised him.

He came to Nazara, where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read, and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll he found the place where it is written:

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me.

He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.

He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And all eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to speak to them, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.'
