# THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD 12th January 2025 Year C

With the Baptism of the Lord, the Church concludes the liturgical Season of Christmas. The Child, whom the Wise men from the East came to adore at Bethlehem, offering their symbolic gifts, we now find an adult at the time when he is baptised in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist.

Today's feast links what we celebrated at Christmas with the rest of the liturgical calendar.

Next Sunday, Jan 19, we return to ordinary time for seven weeks, and then on Ash Wednesday (March 5), we will begin our Lenten journey towards Easter.



In today's Gospel, when Jesus came up "out of the water, then he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit, like a dove, descending on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you."

Jesus's baptism outlines the mission of God's Son to reconcile the fallen world with the Father. Jesus is the new Adam who desires to live as the son of God and do his Father's will.

Jesus' obedience to the Father's will shows us the pattern of our Christian life. However, this kind of life involves a rebirth: we need to be reborn from on high, from God. This rebirth happens at baptism, which the Risen Lord has given to his Church to bring men and women and bring them to a new life. An ancient text attributed to St Hippolytus says: "Whoever goes down into these waters of rebirth (Baptism) with faith renounces the devil and pledges himself to Christ. This person rejects the enemy and confesses that Christ is God and is raised to filial status" Discourse on the Epiphany.

"Look after your work, doing it with enthusiasm, humility, competence, passion and with a spirit that knows how to thank the Lord."

"Watch out for anger that can lead to vengeance; for laziness that leads to existential euthanasia; for pointing the finger at others, which leads to pride; and for complaining continually, which leads to desperation."

## The Baptism of the Lord Year C

#### **First Reading**

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 42:1-4. 6-7

Thus says the Lord:

Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom my soul delights. I have endowed him with my spirit that he may bring true justice to the nations.

He does not cry out or shout aloud, or make his voice heard in the streets. He does not break the crushed reed, nor quench the wavering flame.

Faithfully he brings true justice; he will neither waver, nor be crushed until true justice is established on earth, for the islands are awaiting his law.

I, the Lord, have called you to serve the cause of right;I have taken you by the hand and formed you;I have appointed you as covenant of the people and light of the nations,

to open the eyes of the blind, to free captives from prison, and those who live in darkness from the dungeon.

## A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 10:34-38

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.

'It is true, God sent his word to the people of Israel, and it was to them that the good news of peace was brought by Jesus Christ – but Jesus Christ is Lord of all men. You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.'

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 3:15-16. 21-22

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire.'

Now when all the people had been baptised and while Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily shape, like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'
