Transfigured Body-souls

One often hears the conventional wisdom: 'All religions are the same, with somewhat different packaging.' But do they believe the same thing about the human person?

What if one believed that the most vital part of a person was 'the soul' which alone was destined for Heaven? This is not the Christian belief.

Today's Gospel recounts that Jesus' body was transfigured. This was no out-of-the-body experience of religious ecstasy.

Jesus' body was totally translucent, totally radiant with Divine Light. Every molecule of his materiality was reverberating in the halo of divine glory.

That is the destiny that God also desires for us. When we are really in harmony with God, when we really participate in the life of God, then that Divine Life envelops and permeates our whole person, body-soul. That is our ultimate destiny, but can it be an-

ticipated in the lives of those close to God?

You might care to read the story of St Seraphim of Sarov from the Russian Orthodox tradition. A follower recounts the saint's dazzling bodily transformation, with a blaze of light spilling over onto the snowcovered meadow.

We might pause for a moment to affirm our Christian hope that, with God's grace, we will be radiant with Divine Light, our bodies immersed in translucent glory, and our hearts filled with infinite joy. (Image reprinted from Transfiguration Art - Etsy Canada)

The 24-hour Eucharistic adoration at the Twelve Apostles Church in Jindalee offers a wonderful opportunity to spend time in front of the Blessed Sacrament during this Lent. The adoration will begin with the 9 a.m. weekday Mass on March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation, and will conclude with Benediction the following day. Mass will fol-Benediction Wednesday morning, March 26, at approximately 9:15 a.m.

Eucharistic adoration is a well-known spiritual practice that invites us to spend time in the presence of the exposed consecrated Host. During this 24-hour time, we are called to be with Our Lord, bringing our cares, concerns, prayers, hopes, and thanksgiving to Him. I encourage all parishioners to set aside some time to step away from their busy lives and enter a space where they can connect intimately with their God.

Catholics believe that the consecrated Host is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. Everyone finds their own way of spending time with Jesus before the Blessed Sacrament. At the heart of any adoration is reverence, veneration and a time of silence. In a prayerful way, some people read the Scripture; others sing hymns of adoration, and others open themselves to Jesus' love and adore him in humility of heart. The whole point is to make time for Jesus as we make time for our loved ones (for your spouse, your children, your friends, or any important relationship).

At the back of our two churches, you will find sheets/cards with the schedule to ensure we have at least two people in the church during these 24 hours of adoration. There are 30-minute intervals to secure the continuous presence of at least two parishioners.

If some find it challenging to stay for half an hour, drop in for 10-15 minutes on your way to shopping, a medical appointment, picking up children from school, etc. During the adoration, there will be an opportunity for Confession.

Dear Parishioners,

Darra Jindalee Parish is blessed to have many parishioners who quietly fulfil ministry roles within our community. Each of us has unique gifts, and throughout our journey in life, we are called to share those gifts.

At the beginning of this year, we noticed an increase in children participating in the Children's Liturgy. Currently, the Children's Liturgy is held at Jindalee and Darra. The number of children at the 9 a.m. Mass in Darra, especially during the Sacramental programs, can be 70+. I am sure everyone appreciates and is happy to see so many children at Mass. However, to ensure adequate care for these two groups, we need more catechists who would cover the various roles required for this ministry. I am very thankful to the team who are currently involved in the Children's/Sacramental Ministry. Having so many children sometimes requires the team to take double roles to ensure everything runs smoothly. The Children's Liturgy involves not only delivering lessons but also managing the logistics of this ministry. I appeal to parishioners to help us in this ministry. Attendance of so many children to church on Sunday testifies that our parish is growing and full of "spiritual energy".

Please come forward; Darra Jindalee children need you.

Second Sunday of Lent Year C

First Reading

A reading from the book of Genesis 15:5-12. 17-18

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied, 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off.

Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms:

'To your descendants I give this land, from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 9:28-36

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' — He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow; and when they went into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him.' And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.
