EASTER SUNDAY THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD 20th April 2025 Year C

CHRIST IS RISEN ALLELUIA

The Easter proclamation begins with these words

"Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph!

Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness.

....and it ends with these.

O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to the human."

After the silence of Good Friday, the above words announce the Lord's victory over sin and death. This triumphant hymn and wonderful sacramental is the prelude to the Easter solemnities, which

will last till Pentecost Sunday, June 8. The Exultet is a majestic proclamation of the Resurrection of Christ, a dramatic invitation to heaven and earth to join with the Church in joy and jubilation.

The Exultet poetically expresses the meaning of the Resurrection and invites heaven, earth, and the faithful to rejoice because Christ is risen. The lyrics reflect on Israel's exodus while proclaiming a new "exodus" of the baptised. All Christians are those who pass through the waters of baptism, moving from the slavery of sin to the freedom of being God's children. The night of Resurrection is the most blessed of all nights, the night of the new Passover and redemption.

May the Virgin Mary sustain us with her protection and help us fully experience the joy of Easter so that we can, in turn, share it with all our brothers and sisters who have yet to taste the goodness of the Lord. Wishing you and your families a holy and blessed Easter. Fr Jan

The Easter Holy Water

Water symbolises purification and baptism. Holy water, which has been ceremonially blessed during the Easter Vigil, is considered a sacramental. Sacramentals are "sacred signs that bear a resemblance to the sacraments, through which the faithful gain access to the stream of divine grace that flows from the paschal mystery of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection—the source from which all sacraments and sacramentals draw their power" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, No. 60).

You can take and use the blessed Easter water this year for special prayers and blessings at home. Small bottles are available at the baptismal font of the Twelve Apostles Church for you to fill with Easter water. In the past, a bottle of holy water was commonly found in every Catholic home. This custom seems to have diminished in recent years, so let us restore this beautiful tradition by taking a bottle of Easter water to your home for special prayers and blessings at home. The small bottles are placed beside the sanctuary, and you are most welcome to come and fill them with Easter water.



Sunday 20 Apr 2025

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 10:34. 37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Responsorial Psalm 117

(R.) This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

- Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end.
 Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' (R.)
- 2. The Lord's right hand has triumphed; his right hand raised me up.
 I shall not die, I shall live and recount his deeds. (R.)
- The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone.
 This is the work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes. (R.)

Second Reading

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Colossians 3:1-4

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
