### **Holy Ghost, Holy Gust**



In the very old days, the 'Holy Spirit' was known as the 'Holy Ghost'. It may come from the old English word 'gust' which 'blows wherever it pleases'. St Luke's account of Pentecost tells of what 'sounded like a powerful wind from heaven'. This is the Divine Wind, this is the Holy Gust, the Holy Spirit. Out of nowhere, this mighty Gust burst into the disciples' lives with gale force, sweeping away their fear.

The Divine Wind is nothing less than the Breath of God. 'O Breathe on me Breath of God' is one of the most beautiful hymns, sung to a traditional Irish melody. One verse goes: 'O Breathe on me Breath of God . . . until this earthly part of me glows with thy fire divine'. It is like a log at the back of the fireplace late at night. The log is intact but absolutely glowing through and through with fire. It is to be the same with us.

Peter was inspired to preach to the crowds with a loud voice about Jesus the Nazarene and the fact that God raised him to life. That is the gospel. That is the message which those who breathe with the breath of God have been preaching since the birthday of the Church at Pentecost.

We could pause for a moment to pray an ancient chant of the Church.

The Easter season concludes today with the celebration of Pentecost **Sunday, June 8.** After this, we will re-enter Ordinary Time. However, before that, there are two important feasts in the Church's calendar: the Feast of **the Holy Trinity on Sunday,** June 15, and **the Feast of Corpus Christi,** also known as the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, on Sunday, June 22.

In the Catholic tradition, the Eucharistic Procession is a significant part of the Corpus Christi feast. It serves as a public demonstration of our belief in the real presence of our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

In our parish, we will express our belief in the real presence of our Lord in the Holy Eucharist at Darra after the 9 AM Mass, Sunday, June 22. After the Mass, we will process along Darra Station Road, turning right onto Lee Street and again onto Scott Street. The procession will conclude at the school grounds (the undercover area), where we will have a benediction followed by morning tea and refreshments. I encourage all parishioners to join us and walk together with the Lord through the local streets of our parish.

Additionally, the Archdiocesan Corpus Christi Procession will occur in the afternoon at 2 PM on June 22 at St. Stephen's Cathedral in Brisbane.


In the past, throughout June, many families would pray the Litany to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It might be good to return to this prayer in these days of June.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus, pierced by soldiers and the world's violence, injustice, and oppression, shows God's love for humanity. It is also a source of strength and hope for all who suffer and carry personal crosses of a physical or spiritual nature.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus, then, is not just a symbol of God's love but a call to each of us to respond with our own love for God.

The image of the Heart of Christ is strikingly depicted as crowned with thorns yet aflame with love. This crown, given to Jesus by his tormentors, symbolises mockery and failure, contrasting a majestic crown of gold expected by those who believed he sought to establish an earthly kingdom. However, the irony lies in the heart's fiery love despite the thorns. As described in the Gospel of John (1:5), the divine light cannot be extinguished, highlighting that even surrounded by symbols of suffering, God's love remains powerful and enduring for Christians.

The visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675 truly contributed



to the spreading of the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. in 1856, Pope Pius IX approved the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to be celebrated in the Universal Church. It is celebrated on the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi. In 1899, Pope Leo XIII approved the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus for public use.

### Pentecost Sunday Year C 08 Jun 2025

### **First Reading**

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

### **Second Reading**

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit. There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
